Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

I hope that everyone had a blessed Easter. It is an amazing day that reminds us of the true depth of God's love for each person. Not only are we redeemed, but we also are given a promise of life with God for all time. Easter helps us to put our lives on earth into perspective. This isn't all there is. We have been given the strength to face our present situations with grace and love, because God will always have the final word.

Trinity has been looking at its future with the grace and love that comes from Jesus. There is a large desire on our hearts to love Trafford and do ministry in God's name. But money has been tight over the past few years and keeping the doors open was starting to become a little bit of a concern. For the past two and a half years we have been receiving a grant from the Western PA Conference that helped to pay for part of my salary. This allowed us to place more focus on ministry spending. But we knew this money would not last.

Our District Superintendent approached Trinity with the idea to place our church and First United Methodist Church of Manor on the same charge. This means that one pastor would serve both churches. The pastor's compensation package would be divided between the churches.

After much discussion, prayer and discernment we have decided to move forward with this plan. From a financial point of view this will save the church well over \$20,000 a year. More importantly, this will provide both churches with an abundance of ideas, support, encouragement and human resources to do ministry in our communities.

With any new partnership there will be compromises. Each church currently has an 11 a.m. worship service. Both churches thought it best to change worship times. After considering what would help the pastor as they travel between the two churches, the worship times will be: Manor 9:30 a.m. and Trinity 11:15 a.m. The charge will officially begin on July 1 with the new worship times beginning the following Sunday, July 7.

As our relationship moves forward there will be other changes that will take place, such as times of certain holiday services, having meals together and a number of other things that may come.

## Shoe Drive
