We were spending more that we were taking in. However, we did have some continued relief in the form of equitable compensation through the conference. But still we prayed that God would help us through.

God answered those prayers in a spectacular way. Early in 2019 Pat Nelson got Manor and Trinity UMCs to start conversations about forming a new charge with one another. Those talks have been full of joy and excitement over what God was doing.

Our relationship with each other is still very new. But I am very excited about what is being done in the churches. I look forward to spending the next year with Manor and Trinity in ministry.

God truly has us in God's hands. We have only to walk the path laid before us.

## Helping Hands for Trinity


