Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Perfection is a word that can elicit a couple different reactions. For some, the idea of perfection makes people tired. "I want to be perfect but I can't, so why try." For others it is a motivating factor in constantly improving and getting better. "I will not stop until I am perfect." Either way most of us realize that perfection is no easy feat. It seems to be a goal that is, much of the time, just out of reach. Yet we still hope, that one day, we can find it.

The idea of perfection is even present in Christian thought. It is called (obvious enough) "Christian Perfection." It is a phrase that makes many nervous and self-conscious. We don't always like to hear or think about it. The Christian church believes that we are "going on to perfection." Indeed we can get on board with this. After we leave this world and go to be with Jesus, we will be made perfect in Christ. However, the Methodist church believes that we can attain perfection in this life! This seems ludicrous. We ask ourselves, "Is it really possible that I can stop sinning in this life?" or "How can I be perfect in all I do?"

During the ordination process the Bishop asks the candidates 19 historical questions. These questions have been passed down in the Methodist church for many years. These are just a few of them: 2. Are you going on to perfection? 3. Do you expect to be made perfect in love in this life? 4. Are you earnestly striving after it?

John Wesley had a different take on Christian perfection that I think is very helpful to us as we move into the end of 2015. He quotes 1 Thess. 5:16-18, "Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all

circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus." This, John Wesley says, is the definition of Christian perfection. He goes on to say, "Further than this we cannot go, and short of this we should not stop." We get caught up in our spiritual walk on all the things we should not do, that sometimes we lose focus on what we can do in and through Jesus.

## Refugee Crisis: What Can Trinity Do?

If you watch the news, read the newspaper, listen to the radio...you have probably heard about the refugee crisis. The UNHCR, a United Nations Relief Agency, recorded 59.5 million people as displaced at the end of 2014. Most recently, you may have heard about the wave of Syrian refugees entering Europe. More than four million Syrians have fled the civil war in their country over the last four years. More than 300,000 refugees and migrants have crossed the Mediterranean so far in 2015. About 2,800 migrants died in the attempt.

#### Who/What is a Refugee?

Refugees are people who have been forced to flee their home country because of armed conflict or persecution. The 1951 Refugee Convention and the 1967 Protocol entitle refugees to basic rights under international law. They have the right to illegally enter a country that has signed onto the treaty. They also have the right to housing, work, education, public assistance, the courts, and identification and travel documents. Countries that have signed the treaty are bound to accept refugees under terms set forth.

It can be a tremendous strain on a country's resources to take in large numbers of refugees as is the case with some European countries. UMCOR is working with European organizations to provide displaced people with emergency food vouchers, food packets and hygiene kits.

#### **Hygiene Kits**

During November, Trinity is collecting items and assembling hygiene kits to send for the refugee crisis. Items must be new, unopened and unwashed. We will be assembling kits at the end of November or early December. Date(s) and time(s) will be announced later.

If you want to help further, you may donate to UMCOR's International Disaster Response under Advance #982450. If making the donation through Trinity, please write "International Disaster Response" on the envelope or check memo line.

Over the next several months, the Mission Committee will be exploring other ways Trinity can help with the refugee crisis. If you would like to be part of the conversation, contact Linda Yocum or Pastor Justin.

#### **Hygiene Kit**

(each kits contains)

- 1 Hand towel (15" x 25" to 17" x 27"); no kitchen, cleaning or microfiber towels
- 1 Washcloth
- 1 Comb (sturdy and longer than 6"; no pocket combs or picks; rattail combs and combs without handles are acceptable with a minimum of 6" of teeth)
- 1 Metal nail file or clipper (no emery boards)
- 1 Bath-size bar of soap 3 oz. and larger sizes only; no Ivory or Jergens soap due to moisture content; do not remove from original packaging
- 1 Toothbrush adult size only; do not remove from original packaging
- 6 Adhesive bandages = 3/4" to 1" size; common household Band-Aids
- 1 Plastic bag one gallon size, sealable bags
- \$1 to purchase toothpaste
