

Merry Christmas,

Anticipation is an influential state of being; it is able to alter our sense of time and enhance our eventual enjoyment. It is defined as "the act of looking forward to, esp. with pleasure." But it is so much more than that. It is the honey that sweetens the tea; it is the glass of milk that makes the chocolate chip cookie so much better. No one knows this better than a parent during the season of Advent. As

those days before Christmas tick slowly by the anticipation of our children builds and builds. The closer to Christmas we get, the more we hear "Is it Christmas yet!?"

Then, when Christmas arrives, they are up at 5 a.m., ready to go through the traditions, excited to sing Happy Birthday Jesus, to open up gifts, to eat snacks, to see family. Their anticipation fuels their excitement because the long-awaited day has come at last.

"Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to those on whom His favor rests!"

This is the season of anticipation. This is the time to allow the joy of the Lord to fill you up to bursting. Let us start, this Advent, to live a life of anticipation, to wait excitedly for the activity of Jesus in our life and in the lives of those around us.

Pastor Justin — Thank you so much for the beautiful memorial service you offered in our mother's honor. It was a touching tribute, and it really meant a lot to us.


