I recently received a phone call from an old college buddy of mine. I have not talked to him in about 5 or 6 years. It was nice catching up with him and hearing all the things that he has been up to. But after we were done filling each other in on what had happened over the past years, the conversation ran a little dry. We weren't sure of what to talk about. I don't know when I will talk to him again. If nothing changes, it may be another 5 or 6 years. But if I want our friendship to grow beyond

what it is, then I will have to get in touch with him much sooner and more frequently.

I think our relationship with God is much like that. Sometimes we find ourselves starting a prayer off with these words, "It's been awhile, Lord..." Usually what follows is a particular burden that has been weighing heavy on us for a while or an extreme joy that we want to thank God for. Then after our heart is poured out before God, we wait until it is full again before we pray.

This isn't an uncommon approach to our relationship with God. It recognizes that God is there for us. And when things are difficult we touch base with that relationship. But it lacks the true depth of relationship that is possible with God. It only scratches the surface of what can be.

Our continuing goal for this year is to emphasize the importance of prayer in our lives. I want prayer to be at the core of who we are, not only as a church but also as individuals. When prayer becomes a part of our daily lives then our relationship with God grows ever deeper. There becomes an awareness of the constant presence and activity of God. This awareness moves into desire to walk in that presence. The walking then becomes a joy in living out that love and a hope that others can experience it.

There are many opportunities to increase the amount of time we spend in conversation with our Lord. Every Sunday, "Joys & Concerns" offers a chance to pray for those prayer lists that are spoken and written down. You can sign up to be assigned a prayer partner. A country is singled out to pray for in every *Tempo*. There is a prayer board (on your right as you enter the church). If you have a concern, write it down and someone will take it and pray for it.

We Pray for...

The United Methodist Church through the General Board of Global Ministries (Global

Ministries) is engaged in sharing the Christian faith around the world through new mission initiatives. Education (general and Christian), health (physical spiritual) and outreach programs serve as the basis for developing new faith communities. For nearly 40 years, the Church has been engaged in new or renewed initiatives mission countries. One of those countries is Senegal.

Senegal is the westernmost country in Africa, bordering the North Atlantic Ocean. It has a population of approximately 14 million and is slightly smaller in size than South Dakota. More than 60% of the population is under the age of 25. The country

struggles with a high illiteracy rate and a high unemployment rate—even among college graduates. Poverty is widespread, particularly in rural areas.

Senegal is predominantly Muslim; only four percent of the population are Christian (mainly Roman Catholic). The United Methodist Church began work in Senegal in 1989, primarily through the disaster relief efforts of UMCOR. Currently, there are 19 United Methodist churches and six faith communities in Senegal, with eight ordained pastors and 12 lay pastors.

Leaders from Senegal, Côte d'Ivoire and Global Ministries train pastors, educate children, and raise funds to purchase land for a new mission center and, eventually, for church construction. Two missionaries serve in Senegal.

Bill Gibson, Jr. is the director of the United Methodist Mission in Senegal, organizing congregations and equipping pastors. He also

> is the contact for Senegal Wellness Project which provides medical services to people of all ages and a nutrition program for needy children.

> David Makobo N'Shikala is an agriculturalist with the Senegal United Methodist Mission based in the capital city of Dakar. He works with farmers, teaching them how to grow food in the country's poor soil and how to modern use technology to increase crop productivity.

> Throughout June, please pray for the Senegalese, the United Methodist

clergy, leaders, and mission coordinators, and the Global Ministries and its missionaries.
