We Pray for...

The island nation of Sri Lanka (formerly Ceylon) lies south of India in the Indian Ocean.

The majority of the population is descended from two groups of people (most likely from India): the Sinhalese who arrived in Sri Lanka in the late 6th century B.C., and the Tamil in the 14th century. The Portuguese and Dutch controlled the coastal areas of the island in the 16th and 17th centuries respectively. By 1815 the island was formally united under British rule. Ceylon gained its independence in 1948 and changed its name to Sri Lanka in 1972.

In 1983 tensions between the Sinhalese and a group of Tamil separatists (LTTE) erupted into war. Norway brokered a cease-fire agreement in February 2002; however, in 2006 violence intensified between the LTTE and government forces and fighting continued until May 2009 when the remnants of the LTTE were defeated.

As an island country, Sri Lanka is vulnerable to monsoons, cyclones, and tsunamis. In December 2004 the country was devastated by a tsunami and in May 2016 by Cyclone Roanu. UMCOR provided aid in the aftermath of both of these natural disasters.

Currently, Sri Lanka is suffering through its worst drought in more than forty years. In addition, the country is still recovering from the effects of war; tensions linger between the two groups. The United Nations has launched an investigation into possible war crimes allegedly committed by both sides of the conflict.

Sri Lanka also is a source for human forced labor and sex trafficking. Some adults who migrated to nearby countries to find work have



been subjected to forced labor or debt bondage. Some Sri Lankan women have been forced into prostitution. Within the country, women and children are subjected to sex trafficking.

Throughout March please pray for Sri Lanka: for peace, for an end to the drought and for an end to forced labor and sex trafficking.
