This month we will be praying for the country of Somalia. The country is 99.8% Muslim and less than .1% Christian. The Catholic Church does have a single diocese in the capital of Mogadishu consisting of around 100 adherents. 1991 saw the start of a civil war that placed the country in a political condition called a "failed state." Generally, this is defined as a country that has little to no governmental control. This often results in control placed in the hands of local communities that tend to be loosely connected with one another. Pirating also became an issue off of the coast of Africa because local fishermen were seeking to protect their trade from illegal fisheries. Around 2012 the first permanent central government was established since the start of the civil war in 1991. Somalia has since moved to number 2 on the list of "fragile states," thus showing improvement in its governmental stability. There are many who are hopeful of its continued success.

Somalia is still facing much in the way of civil unrest splinter groups are trying to sow seeds of discord within the country. October 14, 2017 saw the country's deadliest truck bombing. The blast killed more than 300 people and wounded nearly 400 in Mogadishu.

We ask for prayers for Somalia. That they are able to find peace. That the love of the Lord changes hearts and minds as the people come together against such violence.

Global ministries of the United Methodist Church does not have a strong presence in Somalia. But sometimes they provide food during times of drought and other needs through "Disaster Response, International Advance #982450." This advance was put in place to help any country that has an emergency need.
