Prayer List

If you've attended a worship service or browsed the *Tempo*, then you know that we take prayer seriously at Trinity. A prayer list is published weekly in the bulletin and monthly in the newsletter. The "Joys & Concerns" part of the service is dedicated to prayers. The prayer board in the vestibule is for anyone to post a prayer need and for someone else to pluck up that need and pray about it.

When you request person be added to the printed prayer list, he/she will remain on the list for three months with the first month being the month in which the request was made. For example, a request made on April 15 will appear on the prayer list through June. After that the person's name will drop off the prayer list unless you notify the church office that you would like them to remain on it for another three months. If the need for prayer is long-term, then let the church office know of the circumstances when you make the initial request and provide a timeframe.
