Also, fall is a time when all sorts of creatures try to find warmth and shelter indoors. All food in classrooms or kitchens must be stored in sturdy metal, glass or plastic containers with lids. This includes the nursery and office areas. Original cardboard boxes and plastic bags do not provide sufficient protection.

The gas valve to the hot plates in the main kitchen has been replaced as well, making it much easier to close.

The trustees will need to buy a new snow blower before winter arrives. If you are interested in contributing money for this purchase, place it in the collection plate on a Sunday morning or mail it to the church office. Be sure to record "snow blower" on the memo line of your check.

Your Opinion Counts

For years, Trinity has been sending duplicate copies of the newsletter to some households just to meet the minimum number required by the post office for bulk mailings. We even send a small number back to the church. Right now, Trinity pays an annual bulk mail fee of \$225 and a mailing fee of approximately \$35 per month for 200 pieces. These amounts may increase or decrease slightly each year based on approved price changes at the U.S. Postal Service. Ad-Council is considering how to make distribution of the newsletter more efficient and cost effective. Before the board takes any action, the members want to know your opinion. Consider the proposed plan and tell us what you think!

Proposed Plan

- Trinity will continue to publish the Tempo monthly.
- Trinity will stop bulk mailings.
- For those attending church: Printed copies will be available in the church (at the information center or in the vestibule). The newsletter for the next month would be available the last week of the current month. For example, you would be able to pick up February's issue the last week of January.
- For those who live out of the area or who are unable to attend worship regularly due to health reasons: You will have three options: 1) receive it by email, 2) access and read it via the church website, or 3) request to receive a printed copy via first class mail.

We can email the newsletter to anyone who wishes to receive it in an electronic format or you can access it via the church website. If you wish to receive it via email, you will have to provide the church office with your email address. Distribution will be done as a blind copy to protect your privacy.

Please give us your thoughts on this proposed plan. Speak with Linda Yocum, Pastor Judy or any member of Ad-Council. The board will decide on a direction at an upcoming Ad-Council meeting.
