Our senior for the month of August is our dear friend Dorothy Yocum. Dorothy was born October 4, 1929 and was the youngest of seven children. I'm sure many of you remember her brother, Dick Robinson. Both Dorothy and her husband, Bill, were born and raised in Pitcairn. They were married in June 1953 and had four children: Richard, Kay, Linda and David.

Dorothy transferred to Trinity UMC in November 1961 and has been active in many areas of the church over the years. She sang in the choir; served on Missions and Ad-Council; and helped with dinners, luncheons, and VBS. She was also Sunday School secretary for several years until Jeanne Ruccio assumed the role. The Trafford food bank was established about 1985 and was housed at Trinity. Dorothy ran the food bank with support from local churches and later, after it moved to Christian Life and then Level Green Presbyterian, acted as the food bank liaison on behalf of Trinity.

In her personal life, Dorothy was a cosmetologist and owned her own shop in Pitcairn. She maintained her license, cutting hair into her early seventies. She was an aide for Trinity Preschool when it opened in 1981 and assumed the role of director during the 1996-1997 school year. **continued on page 4**



Book Club

September 1 will mark our first monthly book club meeting together. My goal for the book club is to help us engage in writings that challenge us to look for God in the midst of the story. Our first book will be *The Sparrow* by Mary Doria Russell. Here is a brief plot synopsis from Wikipedia.

In the year 2019, the SETI program at Arecibo Observatory discovers radio broadcasts of music from the vicinity of Alpha Centauri. The first expedition to Rakhat, the world that is sending the music, is organized by the Society of Jesus (Jesuits), known for its missionary, linguistic and scientific activities since the time of its founder, Ignatius of Loyola. In the year 2060, only one of the crew, the Jesuit priest Emilio Sandoz, survives to return to Earth, and he is damaged physically and psychologically. The story is told with parallel plot lines, interspersing the journey of Sandoz and his friends to Rakhat with Sandoz's experiences upon his return to Earth.

This was a challenging book when I first read it for seminary. It will spark some strong conversation about evangelism, abuse, God's role in our lives, and mission. There will be aspects you will agree with and some you don't. I look forward to the discussion to which this book may lead us.
