School Kits

Each year, Trinity collects supplies for school kits which are distributed by UMCOR to children around the world. Retailers push school supplies in July and August, so now is a great time to stock up on school kit items.

UMCOR estimates the cost of an entire kit to be about \$11. You are welcome to make up complete kits or to buy just one or two items for a kit. Below is the list of items for one kit. Please do not substitute items. Anything that is not on the list will be removed by UMCOR volunteers.



These are the items of an UMCOR School Kit: paper, ruler, crayons, pencils, eraser, scissors, pencil sharpener, notebooks and re-sealable plastic bag.

If you can't shop, but want to participate, consider making a monetary donation.

Mark your donation "School Kits" and mail

it to the church or place it in the offering plate. Trinity will collect supplies and monetary donations through August 16.

School Kit Contents

The items on this list make up one school kit. Remember, no cartoon characters, advertisements, or religious, patriotic, military or camouflage symbols on any items.

- 1 pair blunt scissors (round tip only); no plastic scissors
- 1 box 24-count crayons
- 3 one-subject notebooks; no composition books, no 2-, 3- or 5-subject notebooks
- 1 pack loose-leaf paper, 100-200 sheet packs; wide or college rule
- lacktriangle 1 hand-held pencil sharpener, 1-inch or longer
- 1 ruler, 12 inches or 30 centimeters; sturdy or flexible
- 6 unsharpened pencils
- 1 eraser, two inches or larger
- 1 two-gallon re-sealable plastic bag (e.g., Ziploc, Hefty, etc.)
