



Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

I know I have said this before, "I am so happy to see and feel the weather get warmer." Seeing the sun shine and feeling the warmth of it are not the only changes taking place. Things are starting to change concerning Pennsylvania's COVID restrictions. This is some welcome news for many.

Starting the first of June, Pennsylvania is rolling back its

COVID-19 restrictions. The CDC and PA have already changed the mask wearing policy, especially for those who are fully vaccinated against COVID. All of these changes will have an impact on the way we worship on Sundays, but it may take a little time.

On the first of June, we will no longer be taking attendance for contact tracing or doing temperature checks. ZOOM will be available for both worship and meetings for the foreseeable future. We have found it to be a valuable tool that helps the accessibility of the worship and events for those who may not be able to make it for one reason or another. All other restrictions will be relaxed in the church. Please be mindful of your distance from other persons and also how comfortable they may or may not be with that distance. We are all coming from a different place and some will be more ready than others to embrace the relaxing of the restrictions. Please continue to be respectful of another person's readiness.

The CDC and PA have lightened the mask wearing policy. If you are fully vaccinated you no longer have to wear masks in most cases. The church service fits within those parameters. But I would like to caution us. The CDC does state that the ability to get COVID is minimal, but still possible and the ability to transmit it to the unvaccinated is reduced but also still possible. Though many have already received their vaccines, not everyone has. I am highly encouraging each person to continue to wear a mask indoors, at least through June. If you are going to speak during the service, you may remove the mask to be better understood. I will continue to
