



Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

As we read our Bible we find many passages that encourage us to connect. We are tasked with connecting with God, with the Church, with each other, and with the community. We must work to put ourselves out where others are in order to share the message

(through word, action, or presence) that we are not alone. But where can we start?

But many homes only have a back porch which is a far more private and disconnected way to enjoy the local outdoors. It speaks to the social shift found in many modern towns.

June brings many fun changes to the typical year. The kids are out of school, vacations start to happen for many, the weather stays consistently warmer, and we tend to spend more time outside. This month marks the beginning of the summer season. It also brings with it some unique opportunities.

Most of us have spent the past six months holed up inside. Now is the perfect time to reclaim that front porch. Start by reading a book outside, eating a sandwich on the porch, or even reading the paper on the front steps (if you don't have a porch). Christ has remained visible to us through the Holy Spirit; reclaiming the front porch is a small way we can remain visible and connected to others. Say, "Hi," wave, or nod to those who pass by. Say a prayer for each person or car you see and ask God to love your community through you in different ways. Jesus fed many with so little. This step can be used by God through God's grace.

I pray this summer is full of prayer, renewal, and connection.
