Someone that wouldn't leave or abuse him. Many have turned to God to find a loving parent. It is one of the reasons that the church is referred to as family. We are all brought together through our Parent who loves us and teaches us to love one another. The Bible speaks plain of God being our Father in much of the Old and New Testaments. The Bible also speaks of God's motherly love as a bird protecting us in the nest (Psalm 91:4 referenced from *Our Daily Bread*, June 21, 2022).

Envisioning God as parent can be helpful for us in many ways and for many reasons, but it is only one way of viewing God. The Bible also shows God as Creator, as we find in Genesis. There are many other titles and roles that are in God's wheelhouse. They are all important to us as Christians, but there are times that some titles are more helpful to us than others.
