Manor First United Methodist Church is in the middle of a Bible Study that focuses on the role of angels. What makes angels a popular topic to discuss? The fascination with angels is nothing new. The book of Hebrews (in the Bible) warns about the worship of angels. We have looked at the different roles that angels have played, starting with Genesis and going to Revelation.

God has used angels for different functions: to be God's ambassador, to share a message with a prophet or someone chosen for a particular purpose, to worship God, to carry our judgments, to protect, to correct. When we look at the life and functions of angels, we see they were created for the service and ministry of God alone.

But Hebrews also reminds us they were created a little lower than humanity. When John of Patmos bowed to worship an angel, the angel responded by saying to worship God alone. Their service to us and the Lord has always been very challenging to me. Their existence is lived solely for the love of God. As I reflect on my life, I see how short I have fallen from my original purpose—to be a reflection of the creative activity of God through my love, worship, devotion and faith.

Angels can teach us so much about God's love and dedication for us. The service of angels to the Lord can encourage us to seek service to God and one another. But it is not just a simple matter of saying, "Don't sin." John Wesley (in his study of scripture) points to something else to strive toward.

¹⁶Rejoice, always, ¹⁷pray continually, ¹⁸ give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus. (1 Thessalonians 5:16-18)

Striving for this will help our eyes and hearts be more focused on the Lord each day. I pray that, through the Holy Spirit, we may always seek to walk the path God has laid before us.

We can also rejoice, because we are not alone on this lifelong journey. Thanks be to God.

E-Giving Update

E-giving is up and running. The insert in this newsletter explains how you can give online or via

mobile app. There are two things to keep in mind as you set up your e-giving: how to pay and cover the fees.

You may pay by credit or debit card or by bank account. The system defaults to credit/debit card. To have funds withdrawn from your bank account click on **Bank Account**.


Trinity will incur fees for e-giving: 2.85% for credit and debit card transactions and 1% for bank account transactions. You may choose to cover these processing fees when entering your payment method. If you choose to cover these fees, simply click on the button. When you cover fees, it adds the percentage to your total donation. You will receive credit for this as part of your donation.

Remember that e-giving does not replace any of the current ways of giving to the church. It is one more way of giving. If you have any questions about e-giving, please contact the church office.
