Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Radical hospitality. It's a phrase that has been thrown around over the past decade or so in our conference. We have been encouraged again and again to show radical hospitality to our church members, to visitors, to the community, to strangers, and even to enemies. But when we look into scripture there isn't a phrase like radical hospitality. In the Bible it is just referred to as hospitality.

There are many examples that show hospitality to others: the good Samaritan, Jesus talking to the woman at the well, the house churches in the epistles, the man who loaned Jesus the upper room, Jesus preparing a room for each of us in his Father's kingdom, the invitation to the thief on the cross, and many others.

None of these are especially radical in their own right. What makes them radical is the resistance our culture tends to have over bringing people into our own space. I grew up with a sense that my house is my space, and all who enter it must play by my rules. But when we look at Biblical hospitality, we see many instances when the life of the person who did the inviting was changed. Jesus' schedule was changed dramatically when he stopped to talk with the woman at the well; Christ brought a thief into paradise; the man had to make room for thirteen people and a meal when he allowed Jesus space for the last supper; the good Samaritan woke up that morning never imagining he would be paying the health care costs of a stranger.

When we welcome people into our life and space certain things about our life and space inevitably change. But we also have the opportunity to share the love of Jesus which we know can change lives as well. I pray we all look for moments we can show God's hospitality to others.

Stephanie has been far better than I at showing hospitality to other people. My family will be hosting Ukrainian refugees in our home for the next several months or longer, starting February 29. They are a mother and daughter, Olga and Marina, respectively. I have provided a letter of introduction written by Olga (page 5 of this newsletter). Please keep them in your prayers as they work to begin a new life in the United States.

Pastor's Letter

Tuesday, February 13, 2024

Hello. My name is Olga, I am married and have two children, a son and a daughter. My daughter's name is Marina, she is 17 years old. We are from Ukraine, from a small town.

I am a primary school teacher by profession and I recently graduated from university and received a specialty as a teacher of foreign languages. I love children very much, that's why I chose this profession, but unfortunately, the war did not allow me to enjoy life and my favorite work.

Remembering the first day of the war, tears come to my eyes. It was terrible. It seemed like a terrible dream. People trying to leave the country, panic everywhere. I didn't know what to do myself. I was in shock. For three weeks I could not come to my senses. I did not understand where to go or how to protect my child.

Over time, I began to get used to this situation and look for opportunities to be useful to our military and defenders. To somehow distract myself, I started going to a group of volunteers. We wove camouflage nets for our defenders. It seemed that life was gaining some meaning, but the endless air anxiety did not allow us to forget that we are still in danger.

Later we decided to leave our home and go to Germany, where my husband is. But it's not easy here either. My daughter didn't leave the house for half a year. She didn't talk to anyone. The German language is very difficult and the mentality is completely different.

We are very grateful to Stephanie and Justin Judy family for agreeing to help us and welcome us into their family.
